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SHADE TREE COMMITTEE

Meeting Minutes

February 6th, 2013

Gary Stachowicz, Hillsdale City Forester, called the Shade Tree meeting to order at 3:05 P.M.

Board members present:

Keith Richard, Carl Heinowski, Dr. Maria Bidny and Angie Girdham. B.J. Holton was excused from the meeting.

Approval of minutes:

Keith Richard made a motion to approve the minutes from the November 28th 2012 meeting. Motion seconded by Angie Girdham.

Public comments:

None.

Old business:

- A. Tree City USA application: Gary informed the committee that the 2012 Tree City USA application has been approved by the State of Michigan and that it has been sent on to the National Arbor Day Foundation for final approval.
- B. Tree Evaluation update: (Hillsdale Community Health Center). Gary announced that on 2/5/2013 the City of Hillsdale received payment from Hillsdale Community Health Center for the sum total of \$3,216.00. Of this \$1,966.00 was for the value of the 33.0 inch sugar maple tree and \$1,250.00 was the removal cost. This money will be used to purchase and plant new trees on major streets in Hillsdale.
- C. New members: Keith stated that at the February 4th 2013 City Council meeting, both Carl Heinowski and Dr. Maria Bidny had their terms on the Shade Tree Committee extended. Mr. Heinowski's term has been extended to 2016 and Dr. Bidny's term has been extended until 2017.

Dr. Bidny wanted to raise a question as to how Gary determines tree planting locations and if he mentions to people about the City of Hillsdale's Public Tree Planting Program. Gary said that he looks at previous tree removal sites and determines if there is sufficient room to plant a tree back at that location. If there is room then he asks the residents if they would like to have the City plant a tree back in the terrace. If they do then he schedules a tree planting date. As of now, he is still working off of the 2009 and 2010 tree removal lists.

As for the Public Tree Planting Program, Gary said he would check but he thinks that information relating to it is on the City's Website. If not, he would get that information placed on the website. Dr. Bidny suggested developing a brochure to help promote the program. Keith suggested that another option may be to send brochures in BPU mailings.

New business:

Note; Agenda items (A,B and C) relate to each other and were put on the agenda because at the time that the packets were mailed out to the committee members, Hillsdale Community Health Center had not reimbursed the City for the tree removal cost or the value of the 33.0 inch sugar maple tree that had to be removed next to the Health Centers new drive approach on S. Howell St. Gary wanted to share with the committee members ,the city tree ordinances, the site plan review of the Health Centers expansion project and the Shade Tree minutes and the Tree Valuation proposal from 2007. The agenda items relate to the steps involved for the removal of any city tree or shrub in conjunction with construction projects.

- A. Review of City ordinances relating to trees/shrubs: As a condition for the removal of any city tree or shrub, permits are required by the contractor before any tree/shrub can be removed or surgically impaired. Sections 14-109, 14-110 and 14-111 address this.
- B. Site plan review from April 25th 2011: Gary mentioned that on April 25th 2011, he conducted a site plan review for the Hillsdale Community Health Centers expansion project. In his comments he mentioned that any city tree(s) that need removal must have values placed on them. This value along with the tree removal cost must be paid for by the hospital or contractor before the tree(s) can be removed. Gary said that on all site review plans involving city trees, he makes similar comments so businesses/contractors know in advance that there is a cost associated with the removal of city trees.
- C. Shade Tree minutes and Tree valuation proposal from 2007: The proposal states that any trees authorized for removal as part of a site review plan or construction project must have values placed on them and the valuation paid in full before any tree can be removed. Gary mentioned that since the Shade Tree Committee adopted this practice he has not had any problems from business/contractors paying for the tree values or the removal cost.

Adjournment:

A motion was made by Dr. Bidny to adjourn the meeting at 3:50 P.M. Motion was seconded by Carl Heinowski.

The next meeting is tentatively scheduled for Wednesday May 1st at 3:00 P.M. in the conference room on the second floor of City Hall.

Discussion led by Brown on an appeal filed by Paul and Laura Rahe, owners of personal property located at 90 S. Broad St., Hillsdale, MI 49242 requesting an appeal from the decision of the code official as a result of being cited under IPMC Section 403.2.

Turnbull spoke about the requirements for an openable window in a bathroom where there is no mechanical ventilation system stating that was the reason for the citation.

A discussion then was held regarding the provisions of section 403.1 which contains an exception indicating that where rooms and spaces without openings to the outdoors are ventilated through an adjoining room, the unobstructed opening to the adjoining room must be at least 8 percent of the floor area of the interior room or space, but not less than 2 square feet. The area in question has two unobstructed doorways exceeding the square foot area of 25 feet into an adjoining room.

Motion by Sharp to reverse the decision of code official finding that the present existing conditions of two unobstructed door openings to an adjoining room exceed the requirements of Section 403.2. The reversal was made based upon the two existing openings remaining unobstructed. Seconded by Pitts. Motion Approved Unanimously.

Motion by Stoll to interpret the exception to unobstructed door openings, seconded by Pitt. Motion Approved Unanimously.

Motion by Sharp, to apply the Board ruling in this case to any future interpretations by Code Inspectors to allow multiple unobstructed door openings to be taken into consideration when determining proper ventilation of otherwise unventilated bathroom openings under IPMC Sec. 403.2, seconded by Pitts. Motion Passed Unanimously

Motion by Stoll to accept Charles Sharp's resignation from the IPMC Board. Seconded by Pitts, Motion Passed Unanimously.

Motion to adjourn by Al Pitts, Seconded by Sharp, Motion Passed Unanimously. Meeting adjourned at 6:25 P.M.

Project Bond Issue (Resolution)

BACKGROUND:

As you may recall, the hospital issued bonds in 2011 for the purpose of constructing the addition to the north side of the hospital inclusive of a 19-bed skilled nursing unit, a replacement obstetrical unit, a kitchen, laundry and storage space and to renovate the existing obstetrical unit to expand the existing 21-bed skilled nursing unit. Inasmuch as the project is nearly complete, the hospital is now issuing bonds to refund the principal amount of the bonds issued in 2011 as well as expenses related to the bonding process.

On January 18, 2013 the Hospital Finance Authority met and approved a preliminary resolution of intent with respect to the issuance of the bonds. On March 1, 2013 a public hearing will be conducted by the Hospital Finance Authority regarding such action.

I have attached a proposed Resolution Approving Bond Issue for Hillsdale Community Health Center Project which, after the public hearing, is being recommended by the Authority for passage by Council. As you can see from the proposed resolution, the bonds will not be a debt or general obligation of the Authority, the City, the State or any other governmental unit and are not payable from tax refunds or other funds of any of those entities.

A regular meeting of the City Council (the "Council") of the City of Hillsdale, Michigan ("City") was held in the City Hall, 97 North Broad Street, Hillsdale, Michigan, on March 4, 2013, at 7:00 o'clock p.m.

RECITALS

- 1. On January 18, 2013, the City of Hillsdale Hospital Finance Authority (the "Authority") approved a preliminary resolution of intent with respect to the issuance by the Authority of its hospital revenue refunding bonds (the "2013 Bonds") for the benefit of Hillsdale Community Health Center, a Michigan nonprofit corporation (the "Hospital"), in the maximum aggregate principal amount of \$28,000,000.
- 2. The Authority intends to provide its assistance to the Hospital pursuant to the Michigan Hospital Finance Authority Act, Act No. 38, Michigan Public Acts of 1969, as amended (the "Act"), for the purposes of improving the availability of hospital facilities to residents of the City and lowering the costs of such improvements and of medical care services generally.
- 3. The proceeds of the 2013 Bonds will be loaned to the Hospital for the purposes of refunding in full the outstanding principal amount of the Authority's hospital revenue and refunding bonds issued on September 28, 2011 in the original principal amount of \$22,000,000 (the "2011 Bonds"), paying the costs of terminating an interest rate swap agreement relating to the 2011 Bonds, funding a debt service reserve fund for the 2013 Bonds, and paying certain costs of issuance of the 2013 Bonds.

Approximately \$17,625,000 of the proceeds of the 2011 Bonds being refunded were loaned to the Hospital (a) to construct a two-story addition (known as the North Addition) to the Hospital's existing hospital facility to house (i) a new 19-bed skilled nursing unit, (ii) a replacement obstetrical unit, and (iii) a kitchen, laundry, storage space and other support areas, (b) to renovate the existing obstetrical unit to be vacated for the expansion and renovation of an existing 21-bed skilled nursing unit, (c) to acquire and install various fixtures, furnishings and equipment in the foregoing facilities, (d) to fund capitalized interest during the construction period, and (e) to pay certain costs of issuance of the 2011 Bonds. The foregoing improvements, certain of which are in the process of being completed, are located at 168 South Howell Street and 170 South Howell Street; City of Hillsdale, Michigan 49242 (collectively, the "Hospital Site"), and will be owned and operated by the Hospital.

Approximately \$4,375,000 of the proceeds of the 2011 Bonds being refunded were used to refinance in full the aggregate outstanding principal amount, together with accrued interest, of two outstanding loans to the Hospital from the Michigan State Hospital Finance Authority, incurred (a) on November 13, 2003 in the original principal amount of \$5,000,000 to construct an approximately 2,200 square foot addition to the Hospital Emergency Department and an approximately 6,000 square foot addition to the Hospital Surgical Department, to renovate the existing Hospital facility, and to purchase medical equipment, and (b) on September 14, 2006 in the original principal amount of \$2,200,000 to construct and equip an approximately 6,700 square foot addition to the Hospital's existing facility to be used as a psychiatric unit. The foregoing improvements financed by such loans are located on the Hospital Site, and are owned and operated by the Hospital.

- 4. The 2013 Bonds will be payable solely from loan repayments made to the Authority by the Hospital. The Bonds will not be a debt or general obligation of the Authority, the City, the State of Michigan (the "State") or any other governmental unit, and will not be payable from the tax revenues or other funds of either the Authority, the City, the State or any other governmental unit. The Authority has no taxing power.
- 5. The Secretary of the Authority has held a public hearing concerning the issuance of the 2013 Bonds to fulfill the public approval requirements of Section 147(f) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, and has submitted to the Council the attached summary of the public hearing.

BACKGROUND: Each year the City of Hillsdale must submit an application to the State of Michigan Department of Transportation (MDOT) to fund our DART operations for the coming year. Attached is a resolution describing the anticipated costs for funding purposes. This is similar but not necessarily identical to the DART budget to be approved by Council during the regular budget process, as it covers a different fiscal year (October 1, 2013 – September 30, 2014).

RECOMMENDATION: I recommend that Council adopt the attached Resolution indicating intent to provide public transportation services and apply for state financial assistance.

FISCAL IMPACT:

This begins the process of providing funding to continue the operation of Dial-A-Ride. As you can see from the Resolution, funds from the federal and state level as well as fares make up the majority of the funding necessary. However, the City contributes a net amount of approximately \$54,000 per year.

BACKGROUND: Aeronautics recently forwarded a contract for a portion of the funding for parcel acquisition at the airport. I have attached pertinent portions of the contract. It includes funding for the State's fiscal year 2011-2012. Additional funding is anticipated and will be dealt with in another contract at a later date. This is the next step in completing the project, acquiring the property to the north of the existing property for future placement of the administration building and hangers. In addition, periodically Aeronautics revises the Terms and Conditions which apply when accepting airport improvement grant funding. New Business D - Cintas Rental Service Agreement

BACKGROUND:

The City has for several years been provided with uniforms and floor mats for various departments by Cintas. This year Bonnie Tew solicited a quite from another provider to determine whether or not the rates being charged by Cintas were competitive. She found that the rates are slightly better from Cintas and recommended that the City enter into the enclosed rental service agreement. The agreement had been modified as a result of recommendations from the City Attorney several years ago.

I have attached a copy of the agreement for your reference.

RECOMMENDATION: I recommend that Council authorize the Mayor and Deputy Clerk's signatures on the agreement subject to final review by the City Attorney.

UNIFORM RENTAL SERVICE AGREEMENT

The customer, its successors and assigns ("Customer") orders from CINTAS CORPORATION or any of its subsidiaries, successors and assigns ("Company") all of the Customer's requirements of garment rental services and other items covered by this agreement during the term of this agreement all in accordance with the pricing, terms and conditions contained herein. Pricing is based on 52 weeks billing per rental item per year.

All garments will be cleaned and maintained by Company. Any garments that require replacement due to normal wear will be replaced by Company at no charge to Customer.

Unless specified otherwise, the garments supplied under this agreement are not flame retardant or acid resistant and contain to special flame retardant or acid resistant features. Flame retardant and acid resistant garments are available from Company upon request. Customer agrees to notify its employees that their garments are not designed for use in areas of flammability risk or where contact with hazardous materials is possible. Customer warrants that none of the employees for whom garments are supplied under this agreement require flame retardant or acid resistant clothing.

Customer agrees to notify Company, in writing, of any hazardous materials that may be picked up by Company in the soiled garments or other textiles served under this agreement.

The weekly rental charge for any individual leaving the employ of Customer can be terminated, but only after all garments issued to that individual, or the value of same, have returned to Company. All garments and other rented items remain the property of Company. If items are lost or damaged by any means Customer will pay the then current replacement values for said items.

This agreement is effective as of the date of execution. The initial term of this agreement shall be as set forth in the attached Agreement and shall automatically renew for the same period of time unless Company is notified, to the contrary, in writing, thirty (30) days in advance of the expiration of the then current term. This agreement may be terminated by either party, without cause and without penalty, costs or damages, whether liquidated or unliquidated, upon thirty (30) days written notice. Termination for cause shall be immediate.

Company guarantees to deliver the highest quality textile rental service at all times. Any complaints about the quality of the service which have not been resolved in the normal course of business must be sent by registered mail to Company's General Manager at the following address: 1720 N. Wohlert Street. If Company then fails to resolve any material complaint in a reasonable period of time, Customer may

terminate this agreement without penalty, costs or damages, whether liquidated or unliquidated, provided all rental items are paid for at the then current replacement values or returned to Company in good and usable condition.

Customer shall be responsible for any unpaid charges on Customer's account prior to termination.

Customer certifies that the Company is in no way infringing upon any existing contract between Customer and any other service provider.

Customer and Company further agree that Special Products Rental Service Agreement dated 3-4-2013 and identified as Contract No. 70719 between the City of Hillsdale and Cintas, as well as any and all other contracts previously entered between the parties, are, upon execution of this Agreement, declared to be null and void and of no further force or effect.
