On October 7, 2022, the City of Hillsdale approved Resolution #3521, granting JB Office Building, LLC an Obsolete Property Rehabilitation Exemption Certificate (OPRA) for property located at 30 & 32 N. Howell Street, Hillsdale, Michigan. This certificate was approved for a period of 10 years, beginning December 31, 2022, and ending December 30, 2032, pursuant to the provisions of Public Act 146 of 2000, as amended.

Resolution #3521 required that the rehabilitation of the facility be completed by October 1, 2024, however, the rehabilitation has not yet commenced. Included in the attachments for this agenda item is the annual report for 2024 submitted by JB Office Building, LLC, which was received by the Hillsdale City Assessor on January 29, 2025. The certificate holder reported \$0.00 in project costs accrued as of December 31, 2024.

JB Office Building, LLC, has informed city staff they are still intending to undertake the project, and they are requesting an extension of the completion date to October 1, 2026. The amendment would ensure the State Tax Commission does not revoke the OPRA certificate while the project remains ongoing, as OPRAs are subject to State Tax Commission review after being approved at the local level.

SUBJECT: Wayfinding Signage Project – Phase III

BACKGROUND PROVIDED BY: Sam Fry, Marketing & Econ. Development Coordinator

The City of Hillsdale Economic Development Corporation voted unanimously to move forward with the third and final phase of the Wayfinding Signage Project at its December 17, 2024, meeting. The Wayfinding Signage Plan was previously approved by City Council on September 21, 2020. Valley City Sign of Comstock Park, MI, is the vendor for this multi-phase project, and the final phase calls for the purchase and installation of six pedestrian-oriented signs at a total cost of \$24,792. This quote comes in under budget, as EDC allocated \$30,000 for Capital Outlay in FY24-25 to be used specifically for this project.

The pedestrian wayfinding signs are the final piece of the larger Wayfinding Signage Project, spearheaded by EDC, which began with a clear goal: to help visitors and residents navigate Hillsdale with ease while showcasing the city's rich history and key area attractions. The new pedestrian signs will improve accessibility in the historic downtown core, guiding pedestrians to shops, restaurants, services, and points of interest. As Hillsdale's role as a tourism destination continues to grow—especially with the Indiana Railroad Experience bringing thousands of visitors downtown each year—this project is more important than ever. By providing clear, welcoming directions, the wayfinding system will enhance the visitor experience, support local businesses, and make exploring Hillsdale more enjoyable for everyone.

RECOMMENDATION:

The EDC Board of Directors have already approved the purchase of the signs for the Wayfinding Signage Project – Phase III in the amount of \$24,792. City staff recommend City Council authorize the Finance Department to process payment to this vendor out of the EDC's Capital Outlay Fund.

Subject: General Fund Per Capita Expenditure Comparison and Ad Valorem

Taxable Value Trend Report

BACKGROUND PROVIDED BY STAFF (David Mackie, City Manager):

Attached are two spreadsheets prepared by city staff to better clarify the City's General Fund revenue/expenditures in comparison to other communities in our region for 2024 and our Ad Valorem Taxable Value trends for the last twenty years as it relates to street reconstruction.

The first spreadsheet is a per capita expenditure analysis based on the June 30, 2024 audited financial statements for Hillsdale and other communities in our region. The report was prepared by the City's Finance Director. The spreadsheet demonstrates that based on the City's total General Fund revenue we receive less and spend less per capita than all other communities compared against. Additionally, the General Fund's expenditures for Public Safety (Police and Fire) alone make up 48% of total expenditures.

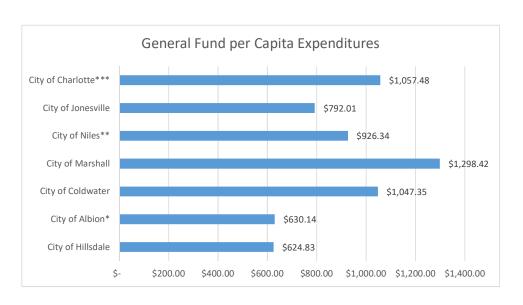
The second spreadsheet is an analysis of the City's ad valorem taxable value and historic investment in road reconstruction. The spreadsheet demonstrates that prior to 2024 the City's taxable value reached its all-time high in 2008. Starting in 2009, the City started feeling the effects of the 2008 recession as property values plummeted. The City hit its ad valorem taxable value low of \$121,748,668 in 2016 vs its' high value of \$162,494,303 in 2008. This was a cumulative 21% reduction in property tax revenue from 2008 levels. After 15 years, in 2024 the City finally recovered from the recession and reached an ad valorem taxable value of \$173,003,934. In 2017 the City began investing more into the road system through the Debt Sinking Fund, Special Assessment Districts (SADs) and a dedicated road millage.

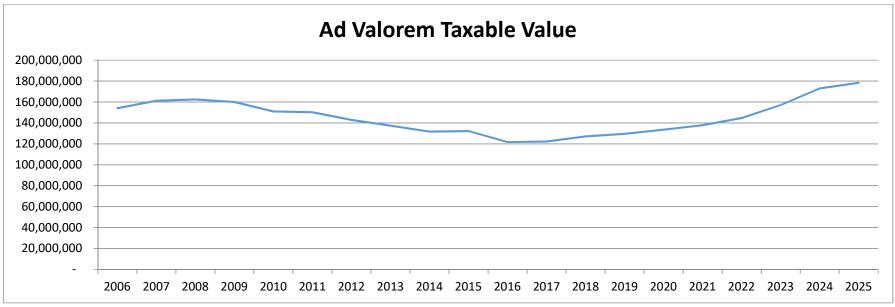

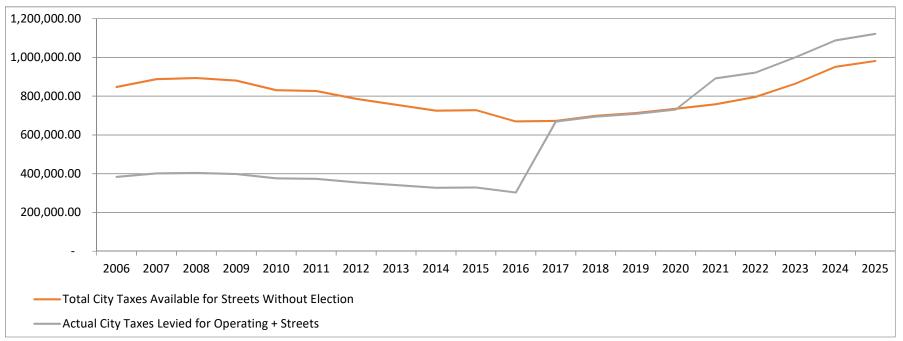

Subject: 2025 SAD Procedure Update

BACKGROUND PROVIDED BY STAFF (Kimberly Thomas, Assessor)

Upon determining that special assessments would be necessary to help offset the costs of street reconstruction projects, the City Manager presented a Road Improvement Special Assessment District Policy to Council at their February 15, 2021 meeting refining the procedures outlined in city charter and ordinance for administration of special assessments. The implementation of all SADs created since 2021 have been administered in accordance with the provisions outlined in this policy.

Staff has been asked to further refine the procedures followed to ensure a more equitable allocation of the costs among the benefiting properties assessed. Based on the concerns and priorities specified, staff submitted a draft proposal to the Public Services Committee at their February 5, 2025 meeting. That committee voted to forward the proposal to the full Council for approval by resolution. That resolution is attached.

RECOMMENDATION:

Adopt the attached resolution providing procedural guidance to staff in administering special assessments.

Resolution to Update the Policy and Procedures Used in Establishing and Allocating Costs to Special Assessment Districts

WHEREAS Michigan's General Property Tax Act and Home Rule City Act provide for properties specially benefitted from certain public improvements to be specially assessed for all or a portion of those costs as determined necessary by local units of government; and

WHEREAS Section 11 of the Hillsdale City Charter provides for the general power of Council to levy special assessments with the "detailed procedure to be fixed by ordinance"; and

WHEREAS Hillsdale Municipal Code (HMC) Chapter 2, Article V, Division 3 provides for the detailed procedure allowing for costs to be allocated "pro rata upon the lots and premises in such special assessment district, according to frontage, or benefits, and shall determine whether such special assessment may be divided into installments and the interest rate to be charged upon the deferred balance from time to time unpaid; provided, however, that such special assessments shall not be divided into more than 15 successive annual installments and the interest charged shall not exceed six percent per year upon the deferred balance..."; and

WHEREAS a "Road Improvement Special Assessment District Policy" document was prepared by the City Engineer and presented to Council at their February 15, 2021 meeting for approval; and

WHEREAS the City seeks to update and refine the special assessment district policy and procedures to provide a more equitable distribution of costs among benefitting properties in alignment with current best practices and community needs.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED, the City of Hillsdale, Hillsdale County, adopts the following procedural guidelines in addition to those requirements set forth by statute, charter, and ordinance, for city staff regarding implementation of Special Assessment Districts (SADs) related to all road maintenance, rehabilitation and reconstruction projects on the City's Major and Local Street system within the City's geographic boundary.

- 1) All roadway related projects within the public Rights-Of-Way (ROW) except those considered Light Preventative Maintenance, i.e.; crack treatments, chip sealing, microsurfacing and ultra-thin overlays, etc., will be subject to these SADs.
- 2) Procedures for the establishment of SADs shall be in accordance, but not limited to, the process as defined in the City of Hillsdale's Charter, Section 11 and Code of Ordinances, Article V.-Finances, Division 3.-Special Assessments and any other applicable sections of the City Charter, Code of Ordinances and/or state law.
- 3) Projects and associated project costs will include all work within the public ROW including work that may be necessary within utility easements for the benefit of the roadway project, i.e.; storm water systems, culverts or other similar types of work.

- 4) Costs for work on utilities, with established funding sources from user rates; i.e.; water mains, sanitary sewer mains and electric systems, etc., will not be included in the final SAD costs to be assessed to parcels within the district.
- 5) The project costs will be shared 50/50 by the City of Hillsdale and the parcels defined as part of the SAD.
- 6) Parcels to be included within the SAD will be those properties with property lot lines that border the ROW of the project roadway, plus parcels where the sole vehicular access is via alley, driveway or easement directly to the project roadway.
- 7) The Assessor shall prepare and present the special assessment roll for confirmation within 90 days of adoption of the resolution establishing the SAD boundaries.
- 8) Unless otherwise directed by resolution, the assessment for parcels within the SAD will be allocated as follows:
 - a) 50% of the estimated total eligible project costs shall be allocated to all parcels within the defined SAD based on the percentage of their actual or implied street frontage to the total actual and implied street frontage of all parcels on the project roadway.
 - b) For parcels with no frontage on the project roadway but that are accessed for vehicular traffic solely by alley, easement or shared driveway directly to the project roadway, the allocation shall be based on an implied frontage of 16.5 feet if there is no specific deeded easement, or the width of their deeded easement factored by 0.5.
 - c) For parcels with frontage on more than one street, a frontage factor of 0.75 shall be applied if the project roadway is the lesser frontage or 0.5 for the greater frontage.
- 9) No individual parcel assessment shall exceed the following maximum limits as determined from the last preceding assessment (tax) roll certified by the Board of Review:
 - a) 25% of the total True Cash Value of the property;
 - b) \$5,000 for any parcel classified as Residential;
 - c) \$10,000 for any parcel classified as Commercial;
 - d) \$15,000 for any parcel classified as Industrial.
- 10) Payment of special assessments may be made in full without interest or penalty on or before August 31 in the year that the assessment is confirmed;
 - a) Payment in full may be made at any time after August 31 with interest only to the date of payment.
 - b) Deferred special assessments shall be split into fifteen (15) annual installments unless every parcel share within the district is \$5,000 or below, in which case the number of annual installments shall be ten (10);
 - c) Annual installments shall be calculated and billed at an amount to include interest as of August 31, subject to the right of advance payment of any such installment with interest only to the date of payment;
 - d) Unpaid installments as of September 1 shall be added to the annual winter property tax bill;
 - e) Interest shall be determined based on the current 10-year Treasury bond rate plus 1% as of the date that Council adopts the resolution establishing the district (not to exceed 6%);

- 11) Adjustments to the final assessment:
 - a) If the "Final" eligible project costs are more than five percent (5%) below the estimated cost, the special assessment roll shall be recalculated, with the difference to be adjusted on the final installment amount or refunded if paid in full prior to recalculation.
 - b) If the "Final" eligible project costs exceed estimates by over five percent (5%), additional pro rata assessments may be made provided that the total special assessment for each parcel may not exceed the limitations listed above.
 - c) "Final" eligible project costs are defined as the actual costs paid to the contractors/subcontractors including but not limited to all labor, materials, and equipment for completion of the project scope less the utility costs as noted above.
- 12) As only a limited number of city streets are eligible for grants, any grants received for a project will be utilized to pay the city's portion of the project costs. Grants will not be used to lessen the 50% portion of the eligible project costs to be assessed to the SAD unless grant language expressly restricts the use of SADs as part of the grant rules.

BE IT ALSO RESOLVED that these guidelines are intended to provide uniformity in procedures but that situations may arise requiring additional scrutiny and adjustment of individual assessments by Council at their discretion, as provided for in statute and ordinance, to be made at the time of the 2nd Public Hearing for Confirmation of the Special Assessment Roll for each district; provided, however, that every parcel shall be assessed equitably based on the benefit received.

SUBJECT: Resolution of Necessity, Set Public Hearing

2025 Special Assessment District - SAD# 2025-10, Monroe Street

BACKGROUND PROVIDED BY STAFF: Kristin Bauer, City Engineer with assistance from Kimberly Thomas, City Assessor

Hillsdale Municipal Code, Section 2-334 – Determination of necessity; notice; hearing, provides,

Before ordering any public improvements, any part of the expense of which is to be defrayed by special assessment, the council shall determine by resolution the necessity and propriety thereof and shall file such resolution with the plans and specifications, estimate of costs and a description of the lands or districts to be affected with the city clerk for public examination. In the same resolution, the council shall direct that notice thereof be given by publication once each week for two successive weeks in a newspaper published and circulated within the city, stating the time and place when the council will meet and consider any objections thereto. Notice shall also be given as required by Public Act No. 162 of 1962 (MCL 211.741 et seq.).

Plans and cost estimates for this Special Assessment District (SAD# 2025-10) were presented to City Council at their January 6, 2025 meeting.

The estimated cost for the overall construction project is \$737,112.50.

According to the City Charter, Sec. 2-335 Hearing procedure, "If more than 50% of the number of owners of privately owned real property to be assessed for such improvement shall object **in writing** to the proposed improvement, the improvement shall not be made without the affirmative vote of seven of the members of the council."

RECOMMENDATION: City staff recommends City Council adopt the attached resolution setting March 3, 2025 as the public hearing date for consideration to establish Special Assessment District (SAD# 2025-10) – Monroe Street and directing notice by publication and mailing thereof. Drawings and estimates will be placed on the City's Website and available for review at the City Clerk's office.

Be it further resolved, that a Public Hearing will held on March 3, 2025 at 7:00 p.m. at the City Hall Council Chambers, at which time the City Council will meet to consider any objections to the improvements, and

Be it further resolved, that notice of the Public Hearing shall be given by publication in the Hillsdale Daily News each week, for two successive weeks and by mail to all affected property owners.

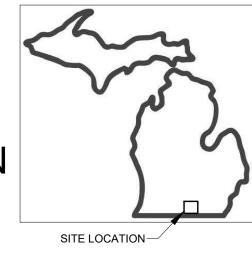

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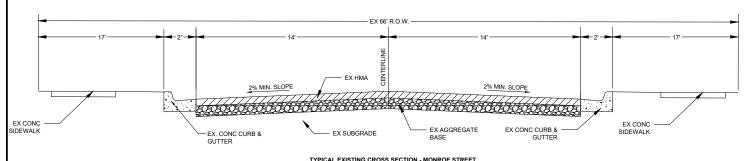

BACKGROUND PROVIDED BY STAFF: Kristin Bauer, City Engineer with assistance from Kimberly Thomas, City Assessor

Hillsdale Municipal Code, Section 2-334 – Determination of necessity; notice; hearing, provides,

Before ordering any public improvements, any part of the expense of which is to be defrayed by special assessment, the council shall determine by resolution the necessity and propriety thereof and shall file such resolution with the plans and specifications, estimate of costs and a description of the lands or districts to be affected with the city clerk for public examination. In the same resolution, the council shall direct that notice thereof be given by publication once each week for two successive weeks in a newspaper published and circulated within the city, stating the time and place when the council will meet and consider any objections thereto. Notice shall also be given as required by Public Act No. 162 of 1962 (MCL 211.741 et seq.).

Plans and cost estimates for this Special Assessment District (SAD# 2025-11) were presented to City Council at their January 6, 2025 meeting.

The estimated cost for the street portion of the overall construction project is \$381,184.77.

According to the City Charter, Sec. 2-335 Hearing procedure, "If more than 50% of the number of owners of privately owned real property to be assessed for such improvement shall object **in writing** to the proposed improvement, the improvement shall not be made without the affirmative vote of seven of the members of the council."

RECOMMENDATION: City staff recommends City Council adopt the attached resolution setting March 3, 2025 as the public hearing date for consideration to establish Special Assessment District (SAD# 2025-11) – Barry Street and directing notice by publication and mailing thereof. Drawings and estimates will be placed on the City's Website and available for review at the City Clerk's office.

SUBJECT: Dial-A-Ride Fare Increase

BACKGROUND PROVIDED BY: DPS Director, Jason Blake

This past January Council approved a Resolution of Intent that is required by the Michigan Department of Transportation (MDOT) as part of the application process for the anticipated 2025-2026 budget, in the amount of \$401,907. The approved resolution reflected that the City would receive 18% (\$72,343) from Federal Sources, 30.5895% (\$122,941) from state sources. The remaining 51.4105% (\$206,623) would come from local ticket fares (\$58,000), advertisement rentals (\$36,000) and the City's General Fund (\$112,623)

To lower the General Fund contribution and to offset the states decrease in funding from the 24/25 and 25/26 FY a price increase was proposed and approved by the Dial A Ride Local Advisory Committee and the Public Services Committee.

Background:

The Police Department requests to purchase handguns to issue to our Officers. The handguns would remain department owned and maintained, all will be the same caliber, make and model. The attached quote is for sixteen (16) Glock 47 MOS package pistols which includes direct mount slide, three (3) magazines, Trijicon RMR type 2 site and suppressor height sights. All factory mounted and installed. The quote includes handgun holsters and five (5) shotguns to replace our 27 year old shotguns. Total for this quote is \$21,621.52.

This expenditure request is also to purchase 9mm ammunition for transition training and duty rounds. Total cost with firearms and ammunition is \$23,546.14. This expenditure is from the Public Safety millage fund.

Recommendation:

Approval is recommended as the department has not furnished required handguns to its officers in approximately thirty five (35) years and is a financial hardship for new hires. The shotguns need to be replaced due to age and malfunction history.

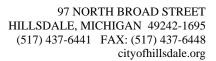
